# A Note from the Executive Director



The world continues to evolve as we hone in our next steps. Since 1965, the Nebraska United Methodist Foundation has existed to support your organization's ministry and mission. We are thrilled to be your partner in ministry, to invest your church's funds, to help you plan for the next generation. So what is that next step for you and for the Foundation?

As we transition from this generation to the next, the highlight from 2023 and into the future is creating a Legacy Society. If you have begun this process, you know that now is the time to have the discussion on the great generational Transfer of Wealth this is taking place. Some counties in Nebraska are in their peak legacy giving, while others may recognize this peak in the next decade or two. But education needs to happen now.

Nebraska City First United Methodist Church is the first United Methodist Church in the State to create its own Legacy Society, called the HOPE Society. HOPE stands for Helping Others by Planning for Eternity. Nebraska City has recognized the need to start their Endowment Fund that every church must have to almost guarantee their longevity for the future generations.

Lincoln Aldersgate continues to support a ministry that provides education, events, and resources centered on caring for the environment. The program helps people to act by providing an understanding of the practical, effective, and easy steps to incorporate nature where they live and work.

# THE BIG GARDEN Food Security

This grant supported current programs offered at The Big Garden and helped fund the New Roots Intern Program which teaches the necessary skills for interns to teach summer classes. The Big Garden hopes to increase the number of schools and classrooms to teach more students about growing food to help fight food insecurity.



## WAHOO FIRST Laundry Church

The grant funds an outreach ministry at Wahoo called "Laundry Church." This is a monthly program where volunteers provide free laundry to members of the community, and while they are at the laundromat, volunteers host an optional, simple bible study.





## Children & Student Ministries

The Vine United Methodist Church is a new church that joined Scottsbluff First, Mitchell, Morrill and Henry Lyman UMCs and sprouted on July 9, 2023 in an introductory service. The seeds for The Vine were planted more than a year ago by Rev. Craig Collins, pastor of Scottsbluff UMC, and Joseph Schumacher, pastor of the other three Scotts Bluff County churches in the Nebraska panhandle. Collins, who has been at Scottsbluff First for eight years, said the idea sprouted from the church's Staff Parish Relations Committee, which pondered the question of increased church vitality, and discussion began to form about getting an associate pastor.

"We really need to focus on children and families to grow our church," Collins said. "But that wasn't in our budget. We feel it's crucial. We have a lot of gray hairs in our pews right now," Collins said, and while The Vine does value its eldest members, "(we need to do) something to change that course." But the decision to merge the churches was not made out of necessity, he added. "We don't want to do this just for survival's sake either," Collins said. "We think it's a way to turn the tide and start the life cycle all over again and renew some energy and help fill our church."

The Vine used its grant funds to pay for curriculum for children and adult faith formation ministries and to get classrooms ready with internet capability and smart televisions.
